PROBLEM: When it comes to a relationship with Jesus, a lot of us want all the answers first, but Jesus wants us to step into the light first because...

We have BLIND SPOTS that prevent us from seeing Jesus for who He really is

BLIND SPOT. (1) a small area on the retina that is insensitive to light due to the interruption, where the optic nerve joins the retina, of the normal pattern of light-sensitive rods and cones; (2) an area or subject about which one is uninformed, prejudiced, or unappreciative; (3) an area in which radio or cell phone signals are weak and their reception poor; (4) any part of an auditorium, arena, or the like, in which a person is unable to see or hear satisfactorily; (5) an area to the side and slightly behind a driver's field of vision that is not reflected in the vehicle's rearview mirror. 	"As Jesus was walking along, he saw a man who had been born blind from birth. 'Rabbi,' his disciples asked him, 'why was this man born blind? Was it because of his own sins orhis parents' sins?" John 9:1-2
2.	The BLIND SPOTS of what we know
	"His neighbors and others who knew him as a blind beggar asked each other, 'Isn't this the man who used to sit and beg?' Some said he was, and others said, 'No, he just looks like him!' But the beggar kept saying, 'Yes, I am the same one!' They asked, 'Who healed you? What happened?'" John 9:8-10

	"Then the Pharisees again questioned the man who had been blind and demanded, 'What's your opinion about this man who healed you?' The man replied, 'I think he must be a prophet.'" John 9:17
4.	The BLIND SPOTS of what we won't we know
	"His parents replied, 'We know this is our son and that he was born blind, but we don't know how he can see or who healed him. Ask him. He is old enough to speak for himself.' His parents said this because they were afraid of the Jewish leaders, who had pronounced that anyone saying Jesus was the Messiah would be expelled from the synagogue. That's why they said, 'He is old enough. Ask him." John 9:20-23
