Four Principles of Biblical Stewardship

"Biblical stewardship is managing God's blessings God's ways for God's glory." – Chris Brown

1 – The Principle of OWNERSHIP

"The earth is the LORD's, and everything in it. The world and all its people belong to him." – Psalm 24:1

"Be fruitful and multiply. Fill the earth and govern it. Reign over the fish in the sea, the birds in the sky, and all the animals that scurry along the ground." – Genesis 1:28

"Remember the LORD your God. He is the one who gives you power to be successful [NIV – "build wealth"]." – Deuteronomy 8:18

- God is the owner, we are the managers acting on His behalf
- Stewardship is an expression of our obedience
- Stewardship is a commitment of one's self and possessions to God

2 – The Principle of <u>RESPONSIBILITY</u>

"Although God gives us 'all things richly to enjoy,' nothing is ours.

Nothing really belongs to us. God owns everything; we're responsible for how we treat it and what we do with it. While we complain about our rights here on earth, the Bible constantly asks, 'What about your responsibilities?' Owners have rights; stewards have responsibilities."

"Honor the LORD with your wealth and with the best part of everything you produce." – Proverbs 3:9

"One-tenth of the produce of the land, whether grain from the fields or fruit from the trees, belongs to the LORD and must be set apart to him as holy." – Leviticus 27:30

"'Bring all the tithes into the storehouse ... If you do,' says the Lord of Heaven's Armies, 'I will open the windows of heaven for you. I will pour out a blessing so great you won't have enough room to take it in! Try it! Put me to the test!" — Malachi 3:10

The Bible makes a distinction between tithes and offerings

- Tithe = the first 10% of your income
- Offerings = any money you choose to give above and beyond the tithe

3 – The Principle of ACCOUNTABILITY

"Nothing in all creation is hidden from God. Everything is naked and exposed before his eyes, and he is the one to whom we are accountable." – Hebrews 4:3

"A person who is put in charge as a manager must be faithful." – 1 Corinthians 4:2

4 - The Principle of REWARDS
