DOCTRINE OF GOD

- 1 Who is God? God is HOLY TRINITY; Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Three persons in one God.
- 2 What is God like? God is perfect in POWER, KNOWLEDGE, and in His HOLY LOVE.

DOCTRINE OF CREATION

- 3 What did God make? God spoke EVERYTHING into being, by His own FREE CHOICE, and it was VERY GOOD.
- 4 Why is there evil? God gave us FREE WILL to obey and we did not.

DOCTRINE OF THE INCARNATION

- 5 Who is Jesus Christ? The eternally begotten Son of God and the Son of Mary. Fully DIVINE. Fully HUMAN.
- 6 Why did the Son of God become human? Because God LOVES us and wants to make us truly CHILDREN of God.

DOCTRINE OF SALVATION - PART I

7 – What is salvation? Through Jesus' sacrificial death and victorious resurrection, we are RECONCILED with God and RESCUED from destruction. 8 – What is required for salvation? We must REPENT and BELIEVE in Jesus Christ.

DOCTRINE OF SALVATION - PART II

- 9 What are the benefits of salvation? We are PARDONED by God, made part of God's FAMILY again, and given RESURRECTION life and power.
- 10 What happens when we live out our salvation in Christ? God CONTINUES to work in us to make us HOLY and BLAMELESS.

DOCTRINE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

- 11 Who is the Holy Spirit? The ETERNAL Spirit of God, who PROCEEDS from the Father and the Son.
- 12 What does the Holy Spirit do? The Holy Spirit LEADS us to repentance, GIVES us new life, and EMPOWERS us to follow Jesus.

DOCTRINE OF THE CHURCH

- 13 What is the church? The church is the COMMUNITY of all true believers, who are Christ's body in the world, CONTINUING the work of the apostles.
- 14 What are the church's sacraments? "Baptism is the holy covenant by which we join the church, and Holy Communion is the church's ongoing act of thanksgiving. Both are means of *PARTICIPATING* in Jesus' death and resurrection."

DOCTRINE OF GOD

15 – What is the world's great hope? Christ has DIED, Christ has RISEN, Christ will COME AGAIN to REDEEM all things, and REIGN as King forever. 16 – What is our future?
