Week One: "Just Pray"

Gut-level honesty

About everything

Continually

• Listen for God's response

PUSH = Pray Until Something Happens

Week Two: Ask God - "Speak to Me"

Be still

- Be willing to listen
- Be ready to respond

Week Three: Ask God - "Search Me"

- To examine your heart
- To refine your thoughts
- To expose your offenses
- To lead you to righteousness

Week Four: Ask God - "Break Me"

- Demolition (tear down)
- Eradication (take away)
- Reconstruction (rebuild)

Today: Ask God - "Make Me Bold"

Four Attributes of Spiritual Boldness

1.	Boldness almost always triggers spiritual
	"They arrested the apostles and put them in the public jail." Acts 5:18
	"They called in the apostles and had them flogged." Acts 5:40
2.	Boldness often releases God's
	"The apostles were performing many miraculous signs and wonders among the people." Acts 5:12
	"An angel of the Lord came at night, opened the gates of the jail, and brought them out." Acts 5:19
3.	Boldness always requires
	"An angel of the Lord told them, 'Go to the Temple and give the people this message of life!' So at daybreak the apostles entered the Temple, as they were told, and immediately began teaching." Acts 4:19-21
4.	Boldness unleashes great in the life of a believer
	"The apostles left the high council rejoicing that God had counted them worthy to suffer disgrace for the name of Jesus." Acts 5:41
