- 2. "Don't wear yourself out trying to get rich." (v. 4)
- 3. "Don't eat with people who are stingy; don't desire their delicacies." (v. 6)
- 4. "Don't waste your breath on fools." (v. 9)
- 5. "Don't cheat your neighbor by moving the ancient boundary markers; don't take the land of defenseless orphans." (. 10)
- 6. "Don't fail to discipline your children." (v. 13)
- 7. "Don't envy sinners." (v. 17)
- 8. "Do not carouse with drunkards or feast with gluttons." (v. 20)
- 9. "Listen to your father, who gave you life, and don't despise your mother when she is old." (v. 22)
- 10. "Don't gaze at the wine, seeing how red it is, or how it sparkles in the cup, how smoothly it goes down." (v. 31)
