EXODUS 20:2. "I am the Lord your God, who rescued you from the land of Egypt, the place of your slavery."

COMMANDMENT #8

EXODUS 20:15; DEUTERONOMY 5:19. "You must not steal." STEAL:

- Taking something that does not belong to you
- From the Hebrew word "ganaf" and it means literally "to carry something away"
- In the ancient world, theft was _____ to define
- In our modern world, theft is much more
- Like each of the other Ten Commandments, this one *looks* simple, but it's like the little stray thread on your jacket that when you start to pull it, it just keeps going and going
- In their broader, fuller, and truest sense, all of the Ten Commandments are rooted in foundational truths that create all kinds of implications for how we live, and by that they envision the best possibilities for humanity, and by that they display the wisdom of God
- God is wise in how He tells us to live, and that's especially the case in the eighth commandment
